# Data Liberation Initiative Partnership

The Data Liberation Initiative (DLI) is a partnership between postsecondary institutions and Statistics Canada. The goal is to improve researcher access to data resources and improve data literacy, especially with respect to Public Use Microdata Files (PUMFs). The program is a critical training ground for postsecondary students who are the researchers of tomorrow, often becoming postgraduate researchers in Research Data Centres.

# Communication & Engagement DLI members

- participate with a network of experts from across Canada on a bilingual listserv
- receive data and technical support from StatCan
- promote and facilitate the availability of StatCan data for educational and academic research purposes
- communicate with StatCan on the data, metadata and educational needs and requirements of their institutions
- dialogue with StatCan subject-matter and Census Program experts on data gaps and the needs of members
- access website information about membership, data and training.

## DLI members sit on two key committees:

- External Advisory Committee Advises Statistics
   Canada on appropriate initiatives and ways to
   implement them to meet the objectives of the DLI
   and to identify the needs and requirements of DLI
   members.
- Professional Development Committee Plans, develops and delivers both regional and national training sessions.

## Data access

- PUMFs are available through Electronic File
   Transfer on day of release staged into SAS, SPSS and Stata.
- PUMFs metadata from Codebooks, data dictionaries, user guides are available coded to DDI standard to use in RDS analysis platform.

- Variable and survey level search engine is available.
- Datasets in addition to all PUMFs include postal code files (\$10,000 value), SPSD/M files and Discharge Abstract Database (DAD) from CIHI are available specifically for DLI members.
- Over 50 **aggregate data tables** (\$15,000 value) are available.
- One free Real Time Remote Access (RTRA) account (\$10,000 value).
- **Digital Object Identifiers** (DOI) are being added to the PUMFs as they are released.

## **Training**

### Professional Development Committee

- provides virtual national training, and in-person national or regional training as needed
- maintains Borealis, The Canadian Dataverse Repository containing web presentations for members to access.

#### Statistics Canada

- provides a participation fee for one participant per member institution to attend in-person national training
- presents online Webinars for new members and contacts
- subject matter presents at training sessions
- offers a limited number of free custom tabulations for students
- offers simultaneous interpretation for national virtual training.
