- 1. The operator of the shipping line is the enterprise that controls the operation and movement of the equipment. The operator is usually responsible for supplying a crew; maintaining equipment in proper worker order; and deciding when, and to which location, equipment will be moved. The country of residence of the operator is, in other words, where the operations are centered. This location may be different from the flag registration of the vessel operated or it could differ from the country of residence of the ship owner.
- 2. The other **European Union** countries includes: Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and since 2007, Bulgaria and Romania.
- Other OECD countries include: Australia, Iceland, Liechtenstein, New Zealand, Switzerland and Turkey.
