Purpose of the Survey

To obtain information on the supply of and demand for energy in Canada. This information serves as an important indicator of Canadian economic performance, is used by all levels of government in establishing informed policies in the energy area and, in the case of public utilities, is used by governmental agencies to fulfil their regulatory responsibilities. The private sector likewise uses this information in the corporate decision-making process. Your information may also be used by Statistics Canada for other statistical and research purposes.

Confidentiality

Statistics Canada is prohibited by law from releasing any information it collects which could identify any person, business, or organization, unless consent has been given by the respondent or as permitted by the *Statistics Act*. Statistics Canada will use the information from this survey for statistical purposes.

Data-Sharing Agreements

To reduce respondent burden, Statistics Canada has entered into data-sharing agreements with provincial and territorial statistical agencies and other government organizations, which have agreed to keep the data confidential and use them only for statistical purposes. Statistics Canada will only share data from this survey with those organizations that have demonstrated a requirement to use the data.

Section 11 of the *Statistics Act* provides for the sharing of information with provincial and territorial statistical agencies that meet certain conditions. These agencies must have the legislative authority to collect the same information, on a mandatory basis, and the legislation must provide substantially the same provisions for confidentiality and penalties for disclosure of confidential information as the *Statistics Act*. Because these agencies have the legal authority to compel businesses to provide the same information, consent is not requested and businesses may not object to the sharing of the data.

For this survey, there are **Section 12** agreements with the statistical agencies of Prince Edward Island, the Northwest Territories, Nunavut as well as with the Ontario Ministry of Energy and Mines, Manitoba Innovation, Energy and Mines, Saskatchewan Ministry of Energy and Resources, Alberta Energy Department, the Alberta Energy Resources Conservation Board, National Energy Board, Natural Resources Canada and Environment Canada.

For agreements with provincial and territorial government organizations, the shared data will be limited to information pertaining to business establishments located within the jurisdiction of the respective province or territory.

Note that there is no right of refusal with respect to sharing the data with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Energy and Resources and Alberta Energy Resources Conservation Board. In addition to being collected under the *Statistics Act*, the information is collected pursuant to *The Oil and Gas Conservation Act and Regulations, 1985* (Saskatchewan) and The Mineral Resources Act (Saskatchewan) on behalf of Saskatchewan Ministry of Energy and Resources, and section 65 of the *Alberta Coal Conservation Regulation* and sections 12.050 - 12.053 of the *Alberta Gas and Oil Conservation Regulation*, on behalf of the Alberta Energy Resources Conservation Board.
