Purpose of the Survey

The purpose of this survey is to obtain information on the supply of, and demand for, energy in Canada. This information serves as an important indicator of Canadian economic performance and is used by all levels of government in establishing informed policies in the energy area. In the case of public utilities, it is used by government agencies to fulfil their regulatory responsibilities. The private sector also uses this information in the corporate decision-making process.

Confidentiality

Statistics Canada is prohibited by law from publishing any statistics which would divulge information obtained from its surveys that relates to any identifiable business. The data reported must be treated in strict confidence, used for statistical purposes and published in aggregate form only. The confidentiality provisions of the Statistic. Act are not affected by either the Access to Information Act or any other legislation An exception to the general rule of confidentiality under the Statistics Act is the disclosure, at the discretion of the Chief Statistician, of identifiable information relating to the public utilities, which includes undertakings supplying petroleum or patroleum products by pipeline, and undertakings supplying, transmitting or distributing gas, electricity or steam. This applies to the dissemination of survey re ults at the provincial or territorial level where only one or two public utilities hay have reported data or where one dominates the industry in a particular purvince or corritory, and to the dissemination of technical information for utilities at the location level.

Data Sharing Agreements

To reduce response burden and to ensure unifor a statistics, Statistics Canada has entered into data sharing agreements with provincial and territorial statistical agencies and other government organ rations for the sharing of data from this survey. These organizations must be the data confidential and use them only for statistical purposes. Statistics Car ada wii. only share data from this survey with those organizations that have demonstree and a requirement to use the data.

Agreements to share inform. "on from this survey exist under Section 11 of the Statistics Act with the statistica agencies of Newfoundland and Labrador, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, British Columbia and the Yukon, regarding business establishments located or operating in their respective jurisdiction. These statistical agencies have the legislative authority to collect this information on their own or jointly with Statistics Canada. Their legislation also contains the same confidentiality protection and outlines similar penalties for disclosure of confidential information as the federal Statistics Act.

Agreements to share information from this survey exist under Section 12 of the Statistics Act with the statistical agencies of Prince Edward Island, the Northwest Territories and Nunavut, reparding business establishments located or operating in their respective jurisdiction, and with Natural Resources Canada, Environment Canada, the National Energy Board and the British Columbia Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources. Under Section 12, you may refuse to share your information with ny of these organizations by writing a letter of objection to the Chief Stat tician and returning it with the completed questionnaire. Please specify the organization with which you do not want to share your data.
