#### TEACHING STAFF SYSTEM

## I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

The format of this manual is similar to the one used in previous years.

# II. <u>COVERAGE</u>

For this survey, data should be submitted for all <u>full-time teaching</u> staff a mployed in public or private degree-granting institutions as of October 1 of the reporting year. Also include full-time research staff who have an academic rank and a salary scale similar to teaching staff. The affiliated and other related colleges on the institutions may be reported by the parent institution or independently as in the past.

#### Full-time include:

- 1. Staff appointed on a full-time basis whose term of appointment is not less than twelve months. (Include any stantament on leave).
- 2. New appointees hired on a full-time basis whose term of contract is twelve months but for the not vear hose can only be at the institution for less than twelve months.
- 3. Staff who were a pointed to teach full-time (12 months or more) and at a later date have entered into a formal agreement with the institution to work on a reduced had basis. This situation usually arises with staff member who are approaching rearement.

<u>Teaching stari</u> for the purpose of this survey, should include, all academic staff within fac Ities (colleges, schools, etc.) who are teachers, researchers (meeting with above criter.), and/or senior academic staff, i.e., Deans, Chairperson, Directors etc.

#### reaching staff include:

- 1. All teachers within faculties, whether or not they hold an academic rank. Those teachers not having an academic rank are referred to as "ungraded" in this survey.
- 2. Academic staff in teaching hospitals (see element 13 for more detail).
- 3. Visiting academic staff in faculties (colleges, schools, etc.).

4. Research staff who have an academic rank and a salary scale similar to teaching staff.

# Staff <u>not included</u> in this survey are:

- 1. Administrators solely responsible for university administration, i.e., pr sident, vice-president, registrar, comptroller, etc.
- 2. Administrative assistants within faculties (colleges, schools, etc.).
- 3. Librarians.
- 4. Non-academic support staff both in faculties (college, school, etc.) and other university departments.
- 5. Markers, demonstrators, lab assistants, etc.
- 6. Graduate teaching assistants.
- 7. Postdoctoral fellows.
- 8. Academic staff within faulties (colleges, schools, etc.) who have been hired as researchers without academ, rank and/or whose salary scales are different from teaching staff.

# III. REPORTING OPTIONS

Data may be sult nitted in three ways:

- A. indiv. unal teacher records on hard copy, in the form of pre-printed computer print-ou.s.
- B. Adividual teacher records on floppy disk.
- C. Individual teacher records on cartridge.

The definitions set out in the elements should be followed for all the options. Those choosing the pre-printed document option may report either (a) by using the codes given in these elements or (b) by providing the data required, in uncoded from, for coding by Statistics Canada. Those institutions using reporting options B (floppy disk) or C (cartridge) should, if at all possible, use the codes given in the elements. Whenever codes other than these are used, please provide a decoding list.

The following are additional comments relating to the reporting options:

# Reporting Option A - Pre-Printed Document

Statistics Canada will provide, in duplicate, a computer printout which shows the information reported by the institution the previous year. The original (after updating) is to be acturned to Statistics Canada; a copy is to be retained by the institution.

In the printout, the data for each teacher is shown on a separate page.

For reporting to Statistics Canada, the procedures should be:

#### 1. For Continuing Staff

For staff included in last year's survey and to be included a rain this year, please check and correct the pre-printed information as follow:

- (a) When the data are correct, no charges need be made.
- (b) When the information is incorrect (and thus needs updating), please cross it out and write the correct information in the space provided for that purpose.

#### 2. For Terminated Stan.

For staff included in last year's survey but not to be included this year (due to their not being enclosed by the reporting institution as of October 1 of the survey year, or their being transferred to a non-teaching area of the institution prior to that date, please complete element 07 only.

## 3. For N w Appointments

For staff not included in last year's survey but to be included this year (e.g., people hired prior to October 1 of the survey year), each institution receives a sufficient number of blank pages on which the information required should be entered and the documents returned to Statistics Canada.

#### Reporting Options B, & C

A record layout is provided in the Appendix.

## IV REPORTING DATE

Each institution is asked to submit data by October 15, of the survey year. It should be possible to submit data by that date on all continuing staff as well as data on new appointments. This submission will be considered final, unless indicated by the institution.

reported.

CODES: Social Insurance Number or som other permanent identification number

providing it is unique and will never be real signed.

NOTE: Please do not leave this 'ement blank.

ELEMENT: Department (Optional)

DESCRIPTION: In this element, report the department to which the staff member is appointed.

For cross-appointments, please report only the department in which the staff member spends the major portion of his or her time.

CODE: For hard copy reporting, write in the rank of the department for new staff.

Institutions reporting on disk or car, idge may use their own codes. If this option is chosen, would you please apply a decoding list. In the past, the first digit of the 4-digit of partment code distinguished between institute, school, centre or lepartment. This will no longer be required. Only a three digit code will be alid.

ELEMENT: Salary Status

DESCRIPTION: This one-digit element provides information on the salary stat is on the

staff member.

CODES:

1. All lay or religious staff paid according to lay (o. regular salary

scales.

2. All religious and military personnel or staff paid according

to salary scales lower than those applying 'a lay staff.

ELEMENT: Actual Salary

### Description:

In this six-digit element, please report the actual gross salary (including vacation pay) the staff member is expected to receive during the salary year. Stipends or other honoraria for administrative duties are to be excluded from the reported salary. (Kyfer to Element 06). Payments for summer employment and extension work should also a excluded when extra payments are made for these. The reported actual salary smould reflect new negotiated settlements applicable as of October 1 and should not include expected increases or adjustments which may become effective at a later date. Where salaries are not negotiated by that date, please still report the new negotiated settlements applicable to October 1, when they become known.

For medical/dental staff, it is understood that, in moderases, the institution itself, provincial medical care institutions (e.g. hospitals) and/or nedical care plan contribute to the staff member's salary at an agreed won ratio. In some institutions, staff receive all their remuneration directly from the university and the university bills the hospital (or medical care plan) for the latur's share. In other cases, the staff member receives remuneration from the university, the hospitals and/or medical care plan. In order to keep the actual salary provided as comparable as possible among institutions, please include, for medical/dental staff, both the university contribution and the contribution by hospitals and/or medical care plans (excluding special grants, fees for services to patients, warm teelecter).

If a staff member i on eave vithout pay for the full salary year or if he or she does not receive an allowant or salary (as is the case for some teachers in religious institutions), please report 00000 for this element. For a staff member on leave for only part of the year and full-time at the institution the rest of the year), the salary reported should be he total poid for the salary year (i.e., the leave portion, if any, plus the amount paid during a sor her period at the institution). For a staff member on reduced load for part of the year or for the full year, the salary reported should be the total paid for the salary year.

## ELEMENT NO. 04 (Cont.)

ONTARIO ONLY: The portion, if any, of the salary derived from non-operating funds should be included in the actual salary figure. The reported actual salary should relate to an institution's normal salary year, and should not be adjusted to reflect the academic year (i.e. July 1 to June 30).

CODES: The actual gross salary paid during the salary year, right justined and zero filled. 000000: Staff on leave without pay for the whoe salary year or staff who do not receive an allowance or salary.

ELEMENT: Annual Rate of Salary

DESCRIPTION:

In this six-digit element, please report the annual rate of salary (including vacation pay) paid to the staff member during the salary year. Stipends or other honoraria for administrative duties are to be <u>excluded</u> from the reported salary. (Refer to Element 06). Payments for ummer employment and extension work should also be <u>excluded</u> when a vtra payments are made for these.

The reported annual rate of salary should reflect new negotiated settlements applicable as of October 1 and should not include expected increases or adjustments which may become effect at a later date. Where salaries are not negotiated by that date, prease still report the new negotiated settlements applicable to October 1, which they become known.

For non-medical/dental staff employed full-time for the full salary year, and not on leave or on reduced 1. ad ciring the year, the annual rate of salary (reported in this element) will be the same as the actual salary (reported in element 04).

For certain types of start, bose employed full time but on reduced load or on leave for part or all of the salary year), the figures reported in element 04 will be less that the annual rate of salary. For salary analysis purposes, it is the annual rate which is important and this is to be reported in element 05

I or star employed full-time with less than a full load, please convert the salary reported in element 04 to annual gross rate of pay. For example, suppose a teacher was hired to carry 75% load and paid a gross salary of \$24, 100. This is the amount which would be reported in element 04.

To relement 05, this amount would be converted to annual rate and a figure of \$32,000 reported.

For those staff on sabbatical leave or other paid or unpaid leave, (for part, or all, of the salary year) please report the annual gross salary that would have been paid had the staff member not gone on leave.

For staff who do not receive an allowance for salary, please report 000000.

#### **ELEMENT NO. 05 (Cont.)**

In addition to the above, there is a further adjustment for medical/dental staff. In element 05, please report (on an annual rate basis), the staff member's income from all sources <u>including</u> such as the operating and trust funds of the university, hospitals and/or medical care plans, and special grants from health or research agencies but excluding fees for service to patients and guarantees. The reported income should relate to the university appointment and not to outside activities unrelated to this appointment.

ONTARIO ONLY: The portion, if any, of the salary derived from non-operating funds should included in the annual rate of salary figure. The reported annual rate of salary should relate to an institution's normal salary year and should not be adjusted to reflect the academic particle. July 1 to June 30).

CODES: The annual rate of gross salary for the salary year, right; ified and zero filled. Please report the salary even if it is the same as that ported in element 04.

000000. Staff who do not receive an allowant or salary and staff on other-than-sabbatical leave for whom an annual rate of salary cannot be easily determined.

CODES: Five digit numeric value, right justified and zero filled. Le ve this element blank if the staff member does not have administrative dutie.

ELEMENT: Year of Termination (for hard copy reporting only)

DESCRIPTION: This **four-digit** element is to be used to indicate those staff members who were included in last year's survey but who are to be excluded in the current year, due to such reasons as (a) they are no longer employed by the reporting institution as of October 1, or (b) they have transferred to a non-teaching area of the institution prior to that date.

CODES: <u>Four digits</u> of the year the staff member ceased to be included in the survey.

If this element is not applicable (i.e., the star member is still to be included in the survey), please leave it black.

ELEMENT: Gender

DESCRIPTION: This one-digit element is to be used to report the sex of the staff r ember.

CODES: 1. Male

2. Female

ELEMENT: Year of Birth

DESCRIPTION: This **four-digit** element is to be used to report the staff member' year of

birth.

CODES: <u>Four digits</u> of the year of birth.

9999: Unknown.

ELEMENT: Year of Appointment to Institution

DESCRIPTION: In this **four-digit** element, the year of appointment (or reappointment)

to a full-time position in a faculty at the institution is to be reported.

Please note that the service between the year reported in this cleme t and the present year must be both full-time and <u>uninterrupted</u> (i.e., the staff member has not severed his or her connection with the institution during this period). Leave (sabbatical, leave of absence, etc.) should not

be interpreted as interrupting the continuous service, i.e., when a staff member goes on leave, it does not change his of her year of appointment to the institution. Similarly, if a staff member assumes a <u>non-academic</u> position in the university for a time and wear and treather runs to teaching, the period spent in that position should not be interpreted as interrupting continuous service. However, during the table person holds such a position he or she should not be a pointed as a full-time teacher.

It does not matter whether the taff me aber's appointment was originally temporary, probationary or permanent of has been a series of one-year contracts. As long as the prologment has been continuous from year to year and full-time neach year, the year of appointment should be reported as the earliest year of the staff member joined the institution on a full-time basis. For example, in year 1, a staff member held a full-time probationary appointment which was made permanent in year 2. Year 1 would be peorted as the year of appointment.

I or the 'afi member who was employed full-time (12 months) during so, 'e past period, then,(1) severed his or her connection with the in 'tituden, (2) he or she obtains a teaching position which is other than 'full-time (12 months), and was later re-hired to a full-time (12 months) position, the year of reappointment is the one that should be reported in this element.

The year of appointment to the institution (as reported in this element) cannot be later than the year of appointment to the present rank (element 22).

<u>Four digits</u> of the year the staff member was appointed (or reappointed) to the institution.

DESCRIPTION: In this two-digit element, please report the staff member's previous employment (or occupation) immediately prior to his or her appointment (or reappointment) to the institution, i.e., the employment (occupation) immediately prior to the appointment year specified in element 10.

This categor, applies to all medical and dental staff who are engaged in the protice of medicine as well as teaching. Geographic full-time staff members usually receive an established percentage of their regular salary from the university and the remaining portion from provincial medical care institutions (e.g., hospitals) and/or medical are lians. In addition, they are entitled to earn an income (limited by a ceiling) for service to patients. The staff members are usually assigned to a specific hospital. Although they may receive only a percentage of their income from the university, they are counted as full-time members of the institution.

For the most part, clinical staff will be included in this category.

# (c) <u>Full-time (12 months)joint appointments</u> - Code 2

This category includes medical and dental staff who have received a letter of appointment from both the university and one of the teaching hospitals. Salaries are paid by both institutions at an agreed upon ratio.

Since this survey covers only full-time teaching staff in faculties (colleges, schools, etc.), the following categories of medical staff are to be <u>excluded</u> from the survey:

### a) <u>Major part-time</u>

These staff members spend approximately 50% of their time in a teaching hospital. Their offices are not located in the hospital and there is no ceiling on the income they earn from outside patients although there is a ceiling on the earnings made through a crinical teaching units.

#### b) Part-time

These staff members are usually community practitioners who do not receive a formal letter of appoint. In from the institution but rather are engaged by department heads as 'emonstrators or teaching assistants. These casual stoff heads as may teach both graduate and undergraduate studen's, on an average of several hours per week, and also may be involved to clinical research.

#### **ELEMENT NO.26**

ELEMENT: Type of Appointment

DESCRIPTION: In this one-digit element please report the type of appointment held by the staff

member at the institution.

Those teachers who have been granted tenure should be code. 1. Teachers for whom, in the normal course of events, e.g., after a cert, in period of time and, in some cases, upon completion of their doctorate, a tenure review a required by university policy are to be coded 2. Staff for whom no tenure review is required should be coded 3. This category includes teachers hired for one portron or more, with no formal commitment on the part of the university to read wheir contract, although the contract may in fact be renewed (or have been relewed). Those reported as code 4, visiting staff, should also have then apported as code 6 or 8 in the second series of element 21.

#### **ELEMENT NO. 27**

ELEMENT: Reduced Load

DESCRIPTION: This two-digit element applies to all full-time (12 months) staff members who

have entered into a formal agreement with the institution to carry his/er du ies

on a reduced load, for the whole year or that part of the year not on leave.

For staff members on reduced load, the annual salary (eieme. '04) must be lower than the annual rate of salary (element 05). For example, if the intensity of the load is 75% for 12 months, we would expect the actual salary to 275% of the annual rate of salary.

For staff members not on reduced load, use de 90.

CODES: Report the intensity of the load.

Example: If, according to contract terms, a staff member is on 75% work

load, indicate 75 in this element.

Valid codes: 10 to 95 Work Load)

ELEMENT: Salary Source (ONTARIO ONLY)

DESCRIPTION: This two-digit element is to be used to indicate if part of the actual alary (element 04) is being paid from other than operating funds.

Example: A staff member

- a) paid wholly from operating funds, please enter '0 in the element;
- b) paid 60% from operating funds, please enter 40 (that portion not paid from operating funds).

CODES: A two-digit code.

#### **ELEMENT NO. 29**

ELEMENT: Final Annual Rate of Salary (ONTARIO ONLY)

DESCRIPTION: In this six-digit element, please report the final annual rate of salary for the staff member (including vacation pay). Stipends or other honoraria for administrative duties are to be <u>included</u> in the reported salary. Payment for summer employment and extension work should be <u>excluded</u> when extra payments are made for these.

The reported final annual rate of salary should reflect s lary rate at end of institutions's normal salary year and it shall be reported after the contract has been negotiated.

CODES: The final annual rate of salary for the salary year. Please report the salary even

if it is the same as that reported in el. men. 05.
